

Enthusia instructors are also on hand to serve as guides if you don't feel ready to tackle the heights on your own. Just ask. 

This scenic walk starts at the final bus stop (Lužická ulice) on city bus lines 1 or 7 and follows the red trail into the park, where a paved path snakes up the hillside to the viewpoint and sandstone obelisk at the top of the Quaderberg (or Kvádrberk) bluff. The spot offers a great view of the city and the Elbe canyon. From here the red trail goes along the ridge. A short detour leads to the Sněžnické vyhlídky viewpoints. Then the route follows an easy course to the stone pavilion Labská stráž. The red trail takes us on along the ridge over the Loubí valley with its sandstone cliffs and rock formations. The path leads to the village of Ludvíkovice. There it skirts the village cemetery and meets the green




From here a detour of 300 m leads to a gorgeous panoramic viewpoint overlooking countless sandstone formations. The viewing area, Růžová vyhlídka, has a railing and a bench.

Back to the trail... and around the bend, the red trail follows a level course through the forest. After 1100 m, it turns to the right, leading to a crossroad marked Pod Kamenským vrchem. The green trail offers a detour to the village of Bynovec, or we can continue along the red trail.

The red trail continues through the forest, taking us to the edge of the plateau above Labská Stráň. But we don't turn off towards the village just yet; going around the garden plots we come to Belvedér, the oldest operational viewing terrace in Bohemian Switzerland. From here, we return along the red trail and then continue for Labská Stráň. As we leave the village, the red trail turns left, descending into the Suchá Kamenice valley, a romantic canyon framed by cliffs.

The trail ends at the roadway. We follow the road along the right bank of the Elbe for about 25 minutes to the bus stop and jetty in Hřensko, from which we can return to Děčín by bus, boat, or ferry and train.







Did you know...

- ...Děčín Castle is one of the oldest historic properties in the Czech Republic? The first written mention of the Děčín province dates from 993 AD; and the first record of the original wooden fortress was set down in 1128 AD.
- ...the last lords of the castle, the Thun– Hohensteins, were among the most influential families in the Austro–Hungarian Empire? Its members regularly occupied top political posts; Franz Thun was the Austrian prime minister at the end of the 19th century.
- ...the castle has welcomed many important figures? For example, Frederic Chopin composed his Děčín Waltz here. And another visit of note was made by the young Empress Elisabeth, or Sissi, whose imperial duties were given their first trial by fire here on an early stay with her new spouse, Franz Josef I.
- ...the access road to the castle, known as the Long Drive, is unique in European architecture? Its actual length (292 m) is enhanced by an optical illusion that still awes visitors today.

 …one of the iconic paintings of the German Romantic school originally hung here? It was "The Cross in the Mountains" (or "The Tetschen Altar") by Caspar David Friedrich. Today the work is a prized possession of the New Masters Gallery in Dresden.

- ...the Thuns assembled one of the greatest libraries in Bohemia? It contained more than 70,000 volumes. Among them were valuable texts on Bohemian history that the great Czech historian František Palacký visited to study.
- ...the world's largest water lily the Victoria amazonica – was coaxed into bloom in the castle's south garden in 1852, a first in continental Europe? The gardens were also renowned for their exceptional collections of orchids, camellias, azaleas, and rhododendrons.
- ...at the foot of the castle bluff is a suspension bridge that is the oldest still standing in its original location in the whole Czech Republic? It was built in 1830–1831.

Děčín Zoological Gardens

So you've decided to spend your holiday in the Děčín area? Then your bucket list of places to visit should include Děčín's zoo.

Not only is it the only zoo in the Czech Republic where you'll find grizzly bears, it's also a great place for the whole family. Děčín Zoo is the fourth oldest in the Czech Republic. And, although it's one of the smaller zoos, it is consistently rated by visitors as one of the nicest.



About the zoo

Děčín Zoo occupies roughly six hectares of land on the wooded slopes of Shepherd's Bluff. It focuses primarily on endangered and lesser-known species. You'll come face to face here with almost 400 animals of 150 species. The zoo's pride and joy are its grizzly bears; this is the only Czech zoo with resident grizzlies, and has been since 1983. There are plenty of other interesting animals too: the Mishmi takin, the Visayan warty pig, the clouded leopard, the vicuña, the West Caucasian tur, the maragay, the maned wolf, the Eurasian wolf, the crested black macaque, the Canadian porcupine, the giant anteater, the red-necked wallaby, the fishing cat, the South American tapir, and many more, including some newly arrived river otters. Popular exhibits include the aviary, the Bohemian-Saxon Switzerland fauna exhibit, and the Paradise Islands exposition (Rajské ostrovy), which visitors will find in the town center roughly 700 m below the zoo. This last is a unique exhibit presenting the fauna of several geographical regions, from coral reefs to mangrove coasts and desert sands. With a ticket to the Děčín Zoo, entry to the Paradise Islands exhibit is free (on the day of purchase). The zoo is open year-round.



Grizzly bears

Grizzly bears have been at home in the Děčín zoo since 1983. In that year, a young pair, Siegfried and Helga, were transferred from the Leipzig zoo. The male, Siegfried, who was soon dubbed Míša by his keepers, was only a year old at the time, while his partner Helga was one year older. Their original home was in the cramped quarters of what is now the Canadian porcupine and prairie dog habitat. In 1997 the pair moved into a beautiful, new natural habitat, which gave them the room that animals of this size require. Their beauty, imposing size, and deceptively peaceful demeanor have made the grizzlies favorites with zoo-goers year after year. In 1994 they earned a place of honor in the zoo's logo.

of the brown bear. Although people often think that bears are carnivores, this isn't true. They are omnivores. Up to two thirds of their diet is made up of vegetable foods, including berries, grass, leaves, fungi, and roots. For the meat portion of his diet, a bear is able to consume just about anything that comes his way, from the grubs he finds under rocks or bark, to small vertebrates such as mice and frogs, all the way up to large mammals. A bear can achieve bursts of speed of up to 40 km per hour, so if he finds a sick or injured moose or deer, he is able to run it down, catch it, and eat it. And he won't turn up his nose at a piece of carrion either, which means he serves a sort of community health policing function, liquidating potentially hazardous carcasses in the neighborhood. A bear's diet varies greatly from season to season. Spring finds him munching on grass shoots, but when the salmon are running in the autumn, he might consume nothing but fish for several weeks. Each fall he puts on up to a quarter of his weight, depositing it in a fatty bump on his back, in order to make it through his long winter hibernation.

The grizzly bear is a North American subspecies

"Our bears are fed seasonal fruits and vegetables, they get bread and rolls, both raw and cooked meat, fish, poultry, and rice or noodles – in order to make their diet as diverse as possible," explains keeper Petr Haberland.

Visitors often ask about how bears hibernate. "Our bears don't go into a real winter hibernation in the winter. There's too much going on around them. What's more, they're fed regularly in the winter, and as long as there's not an extreme frost or a heavy snow, visitors can sometimes see them outdoors in their habitat – but not usually. We leave it up to them whether they want to go out or not and, if they aren't interested, we let them be, especially since they're older animals and need a little more peace and quiet," the keeper adds.

Female Helga is 34 years old and male Míša is 33. For a grizzly bear, that's a ripe old age. In the wild, bears live to about 30, and in captivity to about 35 years. In the course of their time at the zoo, these two have had two litters of cubs, twins and triplets. They won't have any more young though, not only because of their advanced age, but also because the male has been castrated. Castration has left Míša a bit pudgy; males in the wild weigh roughly 450 kg, while Míša weighs about 550 kg. His bulk has taken its toll on his mobility; he spends a lot of time in the pool, where he can float in the water and take a load off.

Míša and Helga are the only representatives of this beautiful bear species anywhere in the Czech Republic and Slovakia.



The Děčín **District Museum**

of water traffic on the Elbe," opened in 1969 as the only one of its kind in the country. The museum library has an enormous collection of material on water traffic and a vast photographic archive of river craft, historic waterways maps for the Elbe and Moldau rivers, construction plans and blueprints, and many other items documenting water transport and shipping. The exposition as a whole is accompanied by graphic and photographic elements, an original ship's wheel, and mechanical

The Town on the Meadow

Of course, the Děčín District Museum also acquaints visitors with the city's earliest history. The exhibit "The town on the meadow" documents settlement here. On view are findings from archeological digs on the Marian Meadow in the 1980s that helped map the history of the area. Visitors will see shards of medieval pottery, skeletal remains, metal implements, and other items of interest dating from Děčín's deepest past.


Děčín over the Ages

Local history is also the subject of "Děčín over the ages," a collection of comparative photography. The images document changes in locations across the city - streets, particular buildings - in side-byside historical and modern photographs.

Birds of Děčín

The permanent exhibit "Birds of Děčín" shows the variety of area birdlife. Modern display cases give the visitor a chance to see and hear the species that are at home in our area. And an interactive segment introduces small visitors to our feathered friends.

Museum Exhibits at Děčín Castle

The Děčín District Museum operates a satellite exhibit at the Děčín Castle. There is the "Castle armory" exhibit, which has weapons from prehistoric times up until the Second World War, including several pieces from the original Thun collections. On display are also paintings by Prague artist Jan Hoffman, who originally decorated various rooms in the castle: bedrooms, the ladies' salon, the cabinet, and the day room. Today, examples of his work can be found only in Prague. Visitors will also notice the strikingly restored wooden ceiling of the armory, which was probably originally decorated with painted ornamentation as well.

Other museum exhibits at the castle include "Baroque Art" and "Děčín Cityscapes." These exhibits include works from the museum collection typical for the Baroque period including sculptural pieces and furniture.

The "Děčín Castle over the ages" exhibit on the ground floor documents the rich history of the castle and its occupants (the Bünaus and the Thun-Hohensteins) until the departure of the Red Army.

Advent at the Museum

During the Advent season, the museum offers a well-visited exhibit of nativity scenes, accompanied by an educational program for children. Also popular is the museum Christmas market, held in the back courtyard. The season is marked by various concerts too.

Aside from its permanent exhibits, the museum hosts a variety of shows over the course of the year focused on local artists or themes. Rare items, kept most of the year under lock and key in the museum vaults, are also periodically taken out and dusted off for public view. For example, in 2017 museum staff is preparing a unique exhibit of curiosities from the museum collections, including a woolly mammoth tusk, a mummified cat, and other treasures.


Podmokly Patch Cake

This traditional local coffee cake, named for a Děčín neighborhood, resembles a patchwork quilt. It has a delectable, leavened base and three toppings - baker's cheese, poppy seeds, and plum preserves.

Crumble the yeast into a mixing bowl. Add the sugar and a little flour. Heat the milk gently and pour it over the yeast mixture. Combine these ingredients, then cover the bowl and set it aside in a warm place to let the yeast proof. When the mixture has started to froth, add the remaining ingredients, taking care that the butter is not too hot. Work the mixture into a smooth dough, cover the bowl with a cloth, and set it aside to rise in a warm place for about an hour.

On a greased cookie sheet or in a shallow baking pan, use your fingers to pat the dough into a thin layer. Using a spoon, arrange the three toppings on the dough in alternating patches, until the whole surface is covered. Bake in a medium oven until the edges are golden and start to pull away from the edge of the baking sheet

> 20 g yeast 1tsp sugar 150-200 ml milk 200 g all-purpose flour 175 g cake flour 100 g melted butter 2 egg yolks 1 pinch of salt





Local Herbs Find a Place in Every Kitchen

A morning without Valdemar Grešík's sublime regional products is simply inconceivable. I'll have a cup of tea and toast with marmalade or a crust of bread seasoned with herbs. When I'm under the weather I'll reach for some tea or a fortifying liqueur. And Mr. Grešík, forever at work in his aromatic kingdom, is constantly coming up with new delights. He founded his company, Valdemar Grešík-Natura, in 1990, soon after the Velvet Revolution. From the very start it produced a proliferation of herbal and fruit infusions, spices, drops, ointments, bath salts, and other wonders.





VALDEMAR GREŠÍK

Valdemar, today your company is well established and your teas and infusions are popular both in Bohemia and abroad. You've come a long way. Tell us something about your early motivations. Were you striving for the quality that was so lacking in those days, or were you driven by a love of nature or a particular life style?

Even before the revolution I had dreamt of having a little shop where I'd stand behind the counter and mix teas and infusions. My dream has become reality; it's just outgrown that one little shop. We still hold to our original commitment to offer the best possible quality at a reasonable price. Our aim has never been to flood the market with mediocre products, but to take pride in offering something worthwhile.

Herbal infusions are your specialty. And your product range has something for everyone. You even have a "Děčín mix" that really shouldn't be lacking in anyone's tea drawer since it's good for a cold, really delicious, and (as my kids would have it) magical... they love to watch their tea changing colors.

Yes, the color shift, from blue to a light green, is thanks to the mallow flower. We're often asked if there are any chemicals in our infusions, but there are absolutely not... just herbs.

The Děčín mix, an herbal infusion for the respiratory system, is a must-have, in winter months, when colds and sniffles are everywhere. Is it your best selling infusion? And do you have a summer favorite?

The Děčín mix is quite popular and is often bought by tourists looking for local products. People have lately gotten into the habit of drinking iced fruit infusions in the summer. We are one of the few manufacturers to offer a fruit infusion without hibiscus. One of our latest infusions is a mix of aronia with rowanberries and strawberries that I think turned out quite well.

The days of mixing herbal infusions in a little shop are behind you. Today you are one of the main producers of local products in Děčín. Your selection has expanded incredibly, from teas, spices, jams, liqueurs, and ciders, you've moved on to brandies. Can you tell us some of your personal favorites?

I love our spices, which don't contain any artificial ingredients. Of our spirits, I like the griotte cherry liqueur, which is more than 50% sour cherry juice. You've never tasted anything like it.



Your griotte is really exceptional. You have a large selection and your e-shop has been in operation for a long time, but you also have a chain of brick-and-mortar shops where people can browse your products. You have three shops in Děčín alone. Are there any differences among them? Where would you recommend that visitors stop by?

We have a small shop next to the museum in Podmokly where we offer mostly our own products. On the other side of the river there are two shops near each other. One offers teas, coffees, and natural cosmetics; the other has our own fruit products, wine, various delicacies, and health foods.

You're a real hometown patriot. In recent years you've devoted a lot of energy to revitalizing the castle and its grounds. Other sites in the city have also earned your attention. What motivates you?

I just like Děčín. My family has lived here since the time of the First Republic. And a good-looking town will attract tourists... that's where I see the future.





The arch spans 26.5 meters at a height of 16 meters and is 7 to 8 meters wide. At its narrowest, the bridge is only 3 meters across. The upper surface is 21 meters up.

No visit to Děčín would be complete without a visit to Děčínský Sněžník, one of Bohemia's oldest standing observation towers, which rises atop the highest table mountain in the country. Sněžník enchants with a magical view of the Lusatian Mountains and Bohemian-Saxon Switzerland.

You can set out for this regional landmark by car. Park in the paid lot and hike the rest of the way on a paved 1.5 km trail to the top of the hill. A restaurant and a buffet offer refreshment at the foot of the tower.





Each season in the gorges has its magic. There is always something new to be discovered even for people who cannot resist returning to this enchanting natural wonder. It is not only the breathtaking boat rides, it is the beauty of the trail which often reveals its romantic side to all wanderers. Those who keep their eyes open are awarded instantly. The hike in the gorges is also an active way of relaxation which makes a perfect escape from the routine of everyday life. All in all, it is an unforgettable trip with a strong emotional experience.

All staff is professionally trained and looks after visitors. Wheelchair users and disabled are welcome. Pets fitted with a muzzel and held on a leash are allowed on boats. 
